# DIVISION MEMORANDUM

#### PREPAREDNESS AND PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES FOR THE WARM SEASON

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Chiefs of Divisions Heads of Sections/Units Education Program/District Supervisors Heads of Public Elementary and Secondary Schools All Others Concerned

- 1. The Department of Science and Technology - Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA) Northern Luzon PAGASA Regional Services Division (PRSD) issued Maximum Temperature of 29°C Computed Heat Index in Basco, Batanes on March 3, 2025.
- 2. The registered temperature of Basco, Batanes, and nearby Island municipalities will continue to increase in the coming days as predicted by DOST-PAGASA.
- 3. To minimize heat stress and prevent any associated health risks with this climatic condition, the following measures shall be observed by all schools in this Division:
  - a. Monitor weather and temperature advisories issued or announced by DOST-PAGASA and other authorized government agencies.
  - b. Learners are advised to stay hydrated.
  - c. Regulate vigorous physical activity during hot days.
  - d. Encourage learners to stay in the shade as much as possible.
  - e. Teachers will monitor the welfare of learners and their own and be cautious of symptoms of heat exhaustion or heatstroke (e.g., dizziness, headache, nausea, vomiting, fast heartbeat).
  - f. Lessen physical outdoor activities when temperatures are high. Outdoor activities should be done early in the morning or in the afternoon when the temperature permits.
  - g. Keep classrooms well ventilated, open windows as early as possible in the morning to allow stored heat to escape from the building.
  - h. Remove all widow curtains to allow air to pass through.
  - i. Minimize the use of electric lighting.
  - j. Switch off all electrical equipment not in use.
  - k. Maintain updated emergency hotline numbers.

- 6. For immediate dissemination, information and guidance.


